We will try to have informational flyers for each project to share with our congregation, their friends, and neighbors.

Derrik Floyd will provide an update to the congregation and announce the Blessing Box campaign during services on March 2nd. Mel Bond will provide a map designating their locations for those who wish to donate directly. For the first three Sundays in March, we will collect in the lobby, non-perishable food items to go in the six blessing boxes in Placentia to support local homeless and needy persons. Derrik will transport and distribute collected items.

Margaret Johnson checked with Rose, and One Life to Love continues to need financial support to assist needy women and their children in 2025. PUMC supported the group in 2024, and monetary assistance was sent. We will continue to aide this group.

Project Phaino needs clothing, socks, shampoo & conditioner, towels, etc. The project managers are also looking for physical assistance with cooking and cleaning. Volunteers can sign up online via the Genius website. Jessie Conaway will share reports of their current needs.

Bruce Beck graciously volunteered to lead the Heifer International project, even though he is having back surgery on March 17th. This effort can be addressed later in 2025. Leisa Luke will assist.

Melanie Palmer will lead us in our support of Solidarity; she reached out to Bethany recently. These projects include after-school programs, food bank, and documentation assistance.

Considering the size of our congregation, your Missions Team is actively pursuing multiple opportunities for outreach and assisting others. It is with great respect that we acknowledge this congregation's zealous support to aide those in need and share the load.

Engaging Community for Lent

Community engagement is more than missions, which may be seen as hands-on work, and it is more than outreach, which often is seen as inviting people through events. It's about building relationships through which mission and missions occur as relationships are deepened, and it reframes ministry away from "ministry for" to "ministry with" those around us. Discipleship begins with relationship and seeks to offer relationship with God and one another, so all can know and experience the love of Jesus Christ.

Here are some ways you may consider engaging our community.

Ashes to Go. Generally, people head home after receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday, not really having an opportunity to engage with other people. One way to create an opportunity for engaging those in the world around you is in the practice of "ashes to go." Once you receive ashes, go out and interact with people. Let them see the joy of your faith, for you are beautiful to those with eyes to see.

Come and See. Whose voices do you need to hear as you think about your church engaging the people around you? Is there a restaurant which could serve as a gathering space, or another safe space for those who wouldn't normally attend worship in a church? People may be open to meaningful conversations if they have the opportunity.

Acts of Kindness. Do an act of kindness and then reflect on how you experienced God's love in doing so. Share your experience with others. It will inspire them and you, too. We'd love to have you share during a service.

Engage with the Local Police. What is the relationship between the church and the police force? Is there a possibility of support the church could offer? We may want to collect gift cards throughout Lent and then give them to police officers at Easter. This idea could be adapted to include first responders and fire fighters as well.

Support a Local Shelter. The church can be the voice that declares everyone's value and worth and then takes action to show love. Learning about the homeless and raising awareness within our community is one way to do so. Supporting the Shower Bus or providing undergarments and hygiene products to local shelters are also practical ways to engage.

Engaging Schools. We may find opportunities to make a difference and help support students through the learning environment. A good place to begin conversations is by asking about the needs of the school, the gifts it offers to the community, the challenges, how the church could serve as a supportive partner. It is important to listen and not assume you know what the school needs. You may discern an opportunity to reach out in small ways, short-term; or you may find yourself working toward a long-term partnership.

I invite you to imagine the hopes and dreams of the community around us and consider implementing some of these ideas. How might our engagement with the community and the relationships that form offer glimpses of resurrection hope?
